Create a Safe Space	Shout
Allocate a quiet, safe area for your dog.	Use a calm, assertive voice rather than shouting.
Keep Things Calm	Punish Accidents
Minimise noise and stress in your dog's environment.	Instead of punishing accidents, redirect your dog appropriately.
Follow a Routine Follow a consistent schedule for activities and rest.	Encourage Bad Behavior Don't reward inappropriate behavior with attention.
Gradual Introduction	S Ignore Warning Signs
Introduce your dog slowly to new faces and pets.	Take note if your dog shows signs of discomfort or fear.
Use Positive Reinforcement Encourage good behavior with treats and praise.	<ul> <li>Rush</li> <li>Don't force your dog to adjust too quickly to their new surroundings.</li> </ul>
Practice Patience	Leave Them Alone for Long Periods
Allow your dog time to adjust and learn new routines.	Avoid leaving your new pet alone for long periods initially.
Provide Adequate Healthcare	S Ignore Unwanted Behaviors
Regular vet visits, vaccinations, and pest prevention are key.	Don't overlook signs of destructive or disruptive behavior.
Train Your Dog	Neglect Mental Stimulation
Foster bonding and understanding through consistent training.	Ensure your dog gets plenty of mental exercise
Offer Plenty of Toys and Enrichment	Forget Vet Care
Keep your dog stimulated with toys and regular play.	Regular vaccinations and check-ups are vital to your

## Regular Grooming

Groom your dog regularly according to their breed requirements.

## Socialise Your Dog

Gradually expose your dog to diverse people, animals and environments. Be sure to consult with your adoption team for guidance before attempting this.

## Show Love and Affection

Express affection for your dog to enhance their well-being. Seek advise as this may need to be done in a specific way. Some dogs do not like to be hugged or picked up.
